

Students are to dress appropriately for camp everyday. We believe that how a student dresses directly influences his/her behavior and attitude while on camps and on stage. Students who are not dressed appropriately may be asked to go home and re-dress OR may loaned the use of appropriate clothing or hair accessories to wear while on campus. Habitual infractions may result in disciplinary actions.

### 1. *Shirts:*

**Preferred:**

- ❖ Tank tops, leotard tops; comfortable T-shirt

**Do Not wear:**

- ❖ Oversized sloppy shirts or T-shirts
- ❖ Shirts with logos or slogans that are offensive or inappropriate for children
- ❖ Skimpy tops that do not adequately cover your body – **no midriff showing**
- ❖ Bathing suit tops or Sports bras alone
- ❖ Shirts that are too tight or too short to lift your arms

### 2. *Pants:*

**Preferred:**

- ❖ Dance pants; knit pants or shorts; jersey shorts

**Do Not wear:**

- ❖ Shorts that come above the finger tips when hands are at your sides
- ❖ Denim of any kind!
- ❖ Pants or shorts that are too low – **no belly buttons showing**
- ❖ Shorts or pants that are baggy or droop below hips or drag on the floor

### 3. *Shoes:* **PLEASE NOTE:** Students wearing inappropriate dance shoes in a performance dance class will not be allowed to rehearse.

**Preferred:**

- ❖ Jazz shoes; athletic sneakers
- ❖ Boys: black jazz shoes

**Do Not wear:**

- ❖ Heavy leather shoes
- ❖ Shoes with heels more than 1/2"
- ❖ Flip flops or sandals or any kind

### 4. *Hair:*

**Do wear:**

- ❖ Hair pulled off of your face, preferably in a ponytail if it is long

**Do Not wear:**

- ❖ Bangs or “whispies” that are in your face or covering your eyes

### 5. *Jewelry:*

- ❖ No long dangling necklaces or earrings; no large hoop earrings
